Stop and think for a moment about your relationship with Jesus. Isn't that the most important thing in your life? As a Christian it should be. It certainly was in Paul's life. As we study his life we see that Jesus was at the center of everything that he did. And what a great life he lived.

It is important for us to learn about what it means to have a relationship with Jesus. We can first ask Him to come inside of our hearts and then we can pray to Him everyday and read the Bible to get to know Him better and better. Then we will find that growing in Jesus and getting to know Him more and more each day is the best thing that can happen in our lives.

The section of scripture that we studied was **Philippians 3:3-11**. The following five devotions are based on either the scripture and/or the theme for Sunday's lesson. As a starting point it would be good for you to review these verses with your children.

These devotions are designed to help you reinforce Sunday's lesson throughout the week with your children, provide some more ideas for the application of God's Word in your children's lives and provide a tool to help in family devotions.

Obviously children at various age levels will respond to the devotional in different ways. You may want to add your own ideas to these to make them more age appropriate.

The Littlest Pharisee

Text: Matthew 5:20 – “For I say to you, that unless your righteousness exceeds the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven.”

Also read Matthew 5:17-20

Day Two

What's the Most Important Thing?

Text: Mark 10:21 – “Then Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, “One thing you lack: Go your way, sell whatever you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, take up the cross, and follow Me.”

Also read Mark 10:17-22

Today we read a story about the rich young ruler who had it made in life. But one day he met Jesus and had to make a decision about what would be the most important thing in his life. What is the most important thing in your life? We have to be careful because if the most important thing in our life is anything other than Jesus then that thing may actually be keeping us away from Him, like it was for the young man in our story.

The rich young ruler had it all. He had all the money he could want, he was powerful and he was still very young. He had his whole life ahead of him. But he knew that he was missing something inside of his heart and Jesus had the answer. He didn't have eternal life and Jesus was the one who had eternal life and could give it to him. So he decided to go to Jesus to find out how he could get eternal life.

I wonder if maybe he thought he would be able to buy eternal life from Jesus. By the way he talked to Jesus it sounds like he thought he deserved eternal life because he was a good man. Maybe he was a good man, but he was still missing something. The one thing that stood between this young man and eternal life was his riches. Jesus told him to sell everything he had and give the money to the poor. He became very sad when Jesus said this and he went away grieved because he had a lot of stuff. His stuff was more important in his heart than a relationship with Jesus.

The most important thing in our lives should be our relationship with Jesus. We need to be willing to give up everything for that. Let's be careful not to allow anything to become more important to us. Jesus wants us to have eternal life, but He will not take second place to anything else in our hearts. He wants to have first place. Have you given Him first place in your heart?

Day Three

Examining Ourselves

Text: 2 Corinthians 13:5a- "Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?"

Also read Proverbs 21:1-3

Can you remember your last math test? Why did your teacher give you that test? No, not because they are mean! Teachers give tests to their students to see if they know the things that they have studied, like math. The Bible tells us that it is important to examine our own lives. It is kind of like giving ourselves a test. The question we need to ask in our own heart is, "Do I know Jesus?" There isn't anyone else in the whole world that can answer that question for us. Only we can know how it is between God and us. Since Jesus teaches us that knowing Him is the most important thing in life then we know it is something very important for us to understand.

How can we examine our lives? We can first ask ourselves if there is a time we know of in our lives when we asked Jesus to come into our hearts. Then we can look to see how Jesus has made us different people. When we ask Jesus into our hearts He will come in and begin to change us. He will work to make us more like Him. So, if we see that happening in our lives then we know that we have a relationship with Jesus.

Paul said that knowing Jesus was the most important thing in His life. It should also be the most important thing in our lives. Have you ever thought that sometimes you didn't need Jesus to help you through a problem, situation, or question? That you could rely on yourself to make a right decision on your own? It is important that as we walk with the Lord each day, that we continually ask ourselves, "What Would Jesus Do?" We must examine our lives to see if we are first of all following Him and then are growing in Him each day. Take a few moments today and ask yourself, "Do I truly believe in Jesus and am I learning what I need to know from Him?" The Lord knows our hearts and what is really inside so we should never try to hide from Him. If you haven't given your life to Jesus, you can today.

Day Four

Discipleship for Jesus

Text: 1 Corinthians 7:17- "But as God has distributed to each one, as the Lord has called each one, so let him walk."

Also read Mark 10:28-31

One day, there was a man who decided that he was going to go with his church on a mission trip to Africa. He had never been to Africa before or even had a real interest in mission work, but he wanted to share the gospel and so he went there for ten days. When he returned home, the Lord began to work in his heart. The Lord put it on his heart to take his family and move to Africa to spread the Word of God. To begin a church so people could learn about the Lord, and come to accept Jesus into their hearts. Immediately, he and his family gave away or sold almost all they had, and gave the Lord their lives to do what He wanted with them.

This is an example of being a disciple. The Lord put something on this missionary's heart and he answered the call to do it. To be a true disciple of Jesus, we must be willing to lay down not only our stuff, but our lives too. To know and follow Jesus means that nothing we have compares to Him and that if He asks us to sell, or give something we have to Him, we must do it.

If Jesus asked you right now to lay down your life for Him, would you? Could you sell your house, car, bike, shirt or favorite toy? Is Jesus worth it? Yes! We must always remember that Jesus died for us so that we might have everlasting life and forgiveness through Him. He suffered on the cross and shed His blood for you and me so that all our sins could be forgiven. Nothing we could give is even comparable to what Jesus did, so if the Lord does ask us to give up something, then we should willingly give it to Him.

Text: 1 Corinthians 9:24 - "Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but one receives a prize? Run in such a way that you may obtain it."

Also read Philipians 3:12-14

It is the championship track meet and all the finest runners are preparing for the big race as they line up at the starting line. As you study the runners, you take note of a young runner named Joey at the farthest end of the starting line. The athletes get ready, get set, and when they hear "Go!" they take off running. The crowd stands on edge; the runners run as fast as they can. After a while the three top place champions are past the finish line. As the crowd cheers and the winners receive their glory, you take notice of Joey who is still running. The race is over but he is still running towards the finish line. After the crowd began leaving the stadium someone ran up to Joey and asked him, "Why do you keep running when you know you've already lost?" He said, "Because it isn't the idea of winning, but giving it my all to try to win the prize."

Each day there is a race that we as believers in Jesus need to run. It is the race of knowing and following the example Jesus has set for us. In the Bible, Paul is a wonderful example of running in a big mission for the Lord. His service to the Lord began with giving his life to Christ, then continued on by spreading the gospel, writing letters to different churches that needed understanding of God's Word and the standard the Lord expected from them.

How do you run your race? The right race to run in is the one that allows you to know, believe, and have a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus. Always remember that Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. Without Him, there is no hope. Find Him and expect the ultimate prize, spending the rest of eternity in heaven. Remember to pray for all come to know Jesus, and make sure to share Jesus with everyone you know, so that everyone can run for the trophy we love and hold dear; our Lord and Savior Jesus.
